## News About Hurricane Michael

Jim Kirk, associate for U.S. disaster response said, "Now that the storm has passed through Florida and Georgia, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance has reached out to the impacted presbyteries and will be deploying national response teams early next week, as well as offering emergency grants. The teams will support the presbyteries with initial assessments and next steps for the response."

Hurricane Michael was a strong Category 4 storm blowing winds in excess of 150 mph when it made landfall near Mexico Beach, Florida. It's the strongest storm to hit the U.S. since Hurricane Andrew in 1992. Michael left much of the Florida panhandle coast in ruins, including Panama City, which was forced to evacuate hundreds of patients from its two hospitals, including intensive care patients. A FEMA official was quoted as saying that Mexico Beach was "wiped out." More than 300,000 residents are currently without power in Florida, Georgia and Alabama.
