How odd it seems that our public schools will be beginning in just a few days. I'm certain both students and teachers view this change with mixed feelings. As I remember, by August the joy of summer vacation had faded and being able to look forward to more breaks throughout the year will compensate for the shortened summer. Let's use the verve and excitement about learning and teaching we expect and encourage in our academics serve to inspire us to bring the same excitement to our Christian education. Learning what it means to be a child of God will bring great joy and deepen our spiritual experiences. One of my favorite Psalms is Psalm 1. It is known as the gateway to the Psalms and gives us a glimpse of what serious yet joyful study of the Word of God can provide. Let's see how it sounds in the Common English Bible.

**Psalm 1**

1 The truly happy person doesn't follow wicked advice, doesn't stand on the road of sinners, and doesn't sit with the disrespectful.  
2 Instead of doing those things, these persons love the Lord's Instruction, and they recite God's Instruction day and night!  
3 They are like a tree replanted by streams of water, which bears fruit at just the right time and whose leaves don't fade. Whatever they do succeeds.  
4 That's not true for the wicked! They are like dust that the wind blows away.  
5 And that's why the wicked will have no standing in the court of justice— neither will sinners in the assembly of the righteous.  
6 The Lord is intimately acquainted with the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked is destroyed.

- \*One large eraser
- \*Six new unsharpened pencils with erasers
- \*One box of 24 crayons (only 24)
- \*CWS requests a donation of \$2.00 per kit for delivery costs.

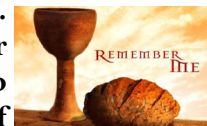
