CAT Volunteers

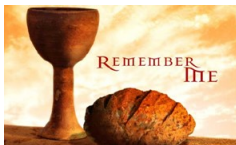

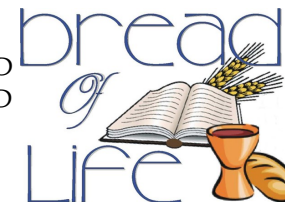

3. WE ATTENDED ANNUAL FOOD BANK TRAINING IN WINCHESTER IN EARLY JUNE.
4. ANNUAL RE-CERTIFICATION OF ALL BOLFP CLIENTS WILL TAKE PLACE ON DISTRIBUTION DAYS 17 AND 19 JULY.
5. WE WILL RECEIVE OUR NEW LAP TOP COMPUTER FROM A 2017 GRANT AND START TRAINING ON THE NEW FOOD BANK DATA COLLECTION PROGRAM IN THE NEXT FEW WEEKS.
