**ALL SAINTS' DAY** is one of the holiest days in the Christian calendar - but when is it and how is marked by followers of the faith?

From the first centuries after Christ, Christians who died a martyr's death were considered saints, who live in God's presence forever. Every year, on the anniversary of the martyrs' deaths, Christians would visit their tombs and celebrate the Eucharist. This practice grew throughout the centuries to include remembering other outstanding Christians on the days they died. Soon the entire calendar was filled with memorials of the saints. In the ninth century, Pope Gregory IV designated November 1 as the day to remember all the saints living in God's presence. All Saints' Day honors all of the known and unknown saints, even those not recognized by the Church, according to the Catholic Faith. Protestants disagree with the idea of *saints* as understood in the Roman Catholic tradition, and generally commemorate all Christians on All Saints' Day; if they observe All Saints Day at all, they use it to remember all Christians both past and present. It is held, not only to remember Saints, but also to remember all those who have died who were members of the local church congregation. In some congregations, a candle is lit by the Acolyte as each person's name is called out by the clergy. Prayers and responsive readings may accompany the event. Often, the names of those who have died in the past year are affixed to a memorial plaque. Some worshippers will use the day to visit the graves of their deceased relatives, placing fresh flowers or lighted candles. In many countries such as Belgium, Chile, France, Hungary, Italy, Poland, the Philippines and Spain, the religious occasion is marked as a national holiday.
