Glory to God in the High St!

Many years ago a pastor in Glasgow, Scotland, named George McLeod chanced to look up at the stained glass windows over the chancel of the sanctuary. The phrase, "Glory to God in the Highest!" was carved in the glass. As he looked he noticed that a pane of glass was broken and missing, the pane on which the letter "e" in the word "highest" was carved. Suddenly he found himself seeing the words that were now there, "Glory to God in the High St." High Street was a nearby avenue. It struck McLeod that the only way to glorify God IS to glorify him in the High St. The only way to truly glorify God is to glorify him where we live, work and play.

WPC's passion is to serve God wherever we are: on Court Street, in the community, in the world. The latest work on the new addition includes handsome wood paneled doors hung throughout the building and elaborate, eye-catching crown molding installed in the pastor's office. There is a delay on the kitchen and bathroom cabinets due to a supplier problem and they should be installed the second week of January. The wheelchair lift is installed and completed.
