This week our contractors and sub-contractors have made up some time that was lost due to rain. The footers for the new boiler room and most of the building have been poured. Patton's Masonry of Edinburg continues to lay concrete blocks on the footers and pipes for plumbing in the new restrooms. It is a tight working area but they are moving forward. July will be a busy month as the Fellowship Hall comes out of the ground. As soon as the sanctuary foundation is stabilized, the final footers will be placed and the final blocks will be laid. The area will be backfilled and the concrete floor placed by the end of July. We will see initial framing in July with finalization in August. With God's help we will see roofing by the end of August. Watch the progress and ask members of the building team about what is happening.
