Minister Musing ...by Pastor Lisa

Far be it from me to shrink from the public limelight. There are people in the world who, like me, get their energy from people - from being around people, from speaking to and with people, from being in gatherings of people both small and large (the gatherings, that is, not the people).

So, for the most part, I don't shrink from being asked to speak in public (which still tops the charts as fear #1 for most Americans). Some might even go so far as to say I am a "ham" ... Or, that I'm in my "element" when in speaking in public. Others might say, "that's a preacher for ya." Could be some or all of the above, I suppose.

I received a letter at the office this week from someone who is running for public office in the state of Virginia. This candidate wants my vote, he says, because, like him, I "have undoubtedly been praying for Godly leadership for our country."
