We've worked up to a near breakneck momentum with the building project since our groundbreaking ceremony in March. These past seven months have truly flown by! We've reached the point where we can see with our eyes what we've visualized with our minds and hearts for many years. God is good!

It shouldn't have come as a surprise to me—yet it did—that it's time to make some decisions about how to use the beautiful space that's being built. We've had requests to use the new Fellowship Hall by civic groups looking for a new home, young people dreaming about their wedding day, even a few people from the community who have decided they want their funeral luncheon held in the new space. One 90-year old woman told me "You all are the sweetest people there. So I talked with my children and made them promise to let me be a Presbyterian for a couple of hours." The woman is Catholic. Go figure.

Ann Grisdale, Clerk of Session, has agreed to chair a Task Force that will explore use of our campus - not just the new Fellowship Hall, but our Sanctuary, Education Building, Preschool and Parking Lot. Comprised of representatives from all church committees, Presbyterian Men and Presbyterian Women, the Task Force will make a recommendation to Session, and the WPC Facility Use Guidelines will become part of our church Policy Manual.

This is an exciting time in the life of our church! With joy we recognize the privilege we have to offer our facility to the community. And we want to be good and faithful stewards of every part of our campus. If you have thoughts about building use, now or in the future, please let Ann or me know. We want everyone to be a part of our faithful stewardship!
