Call to Worship

Psalm 139:1-6, 13-18

- O LORD, you have searched me and known me.
 You know when I sit down and when I rise up;

- ⁴ Even before a word is on my tongue, O LORD, you know it completely.

Call to confession

If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. But if we confess our sin, God who is faithful and just will forgive our sin and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. Let us confess our sin together, trusting God's promised mercy.

Prayer of confession

Holy God, we confess that we too often look upon the wrongs of our society from a distance. We do not see ourselves – our involvement, our interests, our own understandings – in the chaos around us. We pray for peace, for unity, even for justice, but rarely consider what in our own lives might need to change... We come to you, ready to be forgiven, but still unaware of our sins. We ask to be washed clean, but do not offer our whole bodies. Reveal to us our subtle sins, the ways our choices harm others and dishonor You.

Turn us around, so that we can pay close attention to Your Way.

In Christ, all the dividing walls of hostility have come down so that we might live in justice, friendship and peace. Friends, hear the good of the gospel: In Jesus Christ we are forgiven and restored, and set on right paths!
