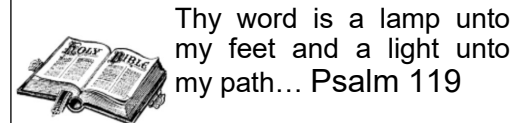

Way back on Epiphany (Jan 6th), we were encouraged to select a “star word” in worship. This was to be a word that would provide God’s guidance

and direction in the new year. “FORGIVING” was the star that chose me. It sits on my desk, visible almost every day, but not quite in the forefront of my consciousness. Nothing stood out immediately when I read my star– I am aware of no personal crisis for which I need to extend forgiveness or for which I need to be forgiven. It also didn’t stand true as a character trait of mine. I often hold on to grudges and perceived injustices. “She was Forgiving” will probably NOT be written on my tombstone. Yet the idea that this word is both descriptive and an action will not let me go–I can have the characteristic of forgiveness through the *act* of FORGIVING... And, if I’m honest, there is ALWAYS an opportunity for me to forgive or to receive forgiveness! The world is full of injustices, disappointments and people who I’d rather avoid. Rather than pushing them out of the way, out of the forefront of consciousness, I will work to bring them to light. Perhaps in the light of the star (which is now on my computer screen) I will become more forgiving...

Minutes of January 27, 2017 Meeting

Jim Carter opened the meeting with prayer at 8:30 a.m. We had 20 people in attendance, 14 men and 6 women.

Jim Carter presented a devotion based upon 1st Corinthians 12:12—by one Spirit we are all baptized.

The minutes of the December 23, 2018 meeting were approved as distributed.

The Treasurer's Report was approved; the current balance is \$11,714.76. Of that amount, after today's actions, \$2,392.66 is unencumbered.

Old Business:

The next Tenderloin Dinner is planned for April 12, 2019. The PW yard sale is scheduled for April 6th. It was suggested that adding and advertising a children's menu might bring in some younger families.

Jerry Germroth reported that he is still awaiting a second bid on the stairway gate but may need to move forward with the current bid. That bid is \$985.00 and Hal Ladehoff has offered to pay for the installation. Hal suggests we move forward expeditiously.

The construction of the Education Classroom is progressing. Wall studding has been completed. The main HVAC duct has been installed so the room is warm, and ESL has begun using it.

The plan is to submit the plan with drawings for a building permit, get the estimate to complete the HVAC ductwork, install the sheetrock on the walls, install the drop ceiling with lighting, install laminate or tile flooring in the main area and pine flooring, courtesy of John Coleman, in the office.

The session has approved a capital campaign to raise the funds for this project and the new air conditioner for the pre-school. Any funds raised over those needed for these projects will be applied to the principal on the loan for the addition.

New Business:

The men of the church have been asked to prepare Easter Sunday breakfast on April 21st. We agreed by common consent.

The ministerial association has asked that WPC provide the Lenten luncheon on April 16th. John Coleman and Carl Nelson will prepare potato and black bean soups respectively.

The senior luncheon for members over the age of 80 will be held on **Tuesday, May 21st** in the fellowship hall. Hal announced that there will be a guest speaker who will discuss Woodstock in the 1950's. He moved that \$300.00 be allotted to cover expenses for this event. The move was seconded and carried.

The session will be asking for annual reports from the various mission teams within the church throughout the year.

Gary Yew recommended the men of the church purchase and install an AED (defibrillator) in the fellowship hall. The cost will be \$975.00 plus \$100.00 for the case. The recommendation was moved, seconded and carried.

The meeting was closed with prayer by Jim Carter and adjourned at 9:35 a.m.
