The minutes of the June 23, 2019 meeting with notes from the July 13, 2019 picnic were approved as distributed.

The treasurer's report shows a balance of \$9,204.16. The treasurer's report was approved as presented.

**Old Business:**

The spaghetti dinner last week was a great success. Gross receipts top \$1,000.00. A tenderloin dinner is planned for October 18<sup>th</sup> and another spaghetti dinner for November 15<sup>th</sup>.

Woodworking for the floors and trim for the ESL room is progressing nicely. The core group working on the project will determine when work days will be needed and notify everyone.

Gary suggests waiting to proceed with the sound system until the ESL room is complete.

**New Business:**

Pastor Kate and Ernie Grisdale acknowledge that there needs to be coordination between the church treasurer (the general fund) and the men's account to assure that bills are being paid from the appropriate accounts.

We will be working with the session on obtaining a generator.

Ernie Grisdale suggests a fishing outing at their Cedar Creek cabin to encourage younger families participation in church activities. We will target March or April for this event.
